## Camp Tomahawk 2012 Youth Volunteer Code of Conduct

By signing below, you acknowledge the expectations and rules set forth by the staff of Camp Tomahawk for youth volunteers. Youth staff volunteers are integral to the success of Camp Tomahawk, and we expect you to take the role seriously.

- 1. All youth volunteers must be registered using the online registration site provided. No youth staff will be allowed on campus if he/she is not previously registered to be there. Any first year Boy Scout, or non-Boy Scout who is entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade for the coming school year, must also have a parent volunteer on site.
- 2. Youth staff must attend at least one of the training sessions held before the start of camp. If you do not attend one of the sessions, you will not be allowed to participate as a volunteer.
- 3. All volunteers must be in day camp uniform daily, and must sign in and out daily. All youth volunteers will report to the Scoutmaster, regardless of specific Scout or non-Scout status while at day camp.
- 4. Youth volunteers are expected to stay with their assigned den or station during the campers' activity rotations. Wandering will not be permitted.
- 5. Youth volunteers are expected to perform duties as assigned by their den or station leader. If you feel you are being asked to do something inappropriate or uncomfortable, you must communicate with the Scoutmaster immediately, who will assess the situation and help to resolve any issues.
- 6. The Scoutmaster reserves the right to reassign any youth volunteer if it is deemed necessary.
- 7. Electronic devices, hand held games, and other personal entertainment is not allowed during campers' rotations. No texting, no phone calls, games, etc. If you chose to do these activities during a sanctioned break time, please take it out of sight of the Cub Scouts.
- 8. If you are going to be late or need to leave early, you must communicate that information with your assigned den or station leader, and the Scoutmaster, in advance (before camp starts) (i.e. sports camps, driver's ed, summer school, etc). The adults will depend on you to help with their dens and/or stations, and need to know if you're not going to be there for any reason.
- 9. All day camp equipment and activities are for Cub Scout use only, unless permitted by the Scoutmaster. Youth staff may be given opportunities to use certain areas of camp during break times, but only with the explicit permission of the Scoutmaster and the respective station leader.
- 10. If a youth staff member is found to be not following these rules and expectations, or is doing anything dangerous, or generally unacceptable in a Cub Scout day camp setting, he/she will be asked to leave. If asked to leave, he/she may also forfeit any service hours performed, at the discretion of the Scoutmaster. Scouts are expected to follow the Scout Oath and Laws.
