2) National Jamboree

Hurry, Hurry Hurry. Limited time and space available for you to join the Baltimore Area Council's Contingent to Jamboree 2017!

Register with the Baltimore contingent and Pay your deposit BEFORE May 1st. 2016 to be guaranteed a spot with Scouts in your local area. After May 1st 2016 we will do our best to find the closes spot for you but it may be with a unit from Pennsylvania or Virginia.

Registration for Jamboree has 3 steps, all must be completed for you to go with us.

A) Register with the Baltimore Area Council Contingent

B) Pay your Deposit through Double Knot

Make sure to Scroll to the very bottom of the first page for the [ Register ] Button.

C) Register with the National 2017 Jamboree

Attention Boy Scout Leaders,

A new session of Eagle Coach Training has been scheduled by the District Advancement Committee for Sunday, April 24, from 2:00 – 5:00 PM at the Knights of Columbus hall on Solomons Island Rd.

This training is a great opportunity to involve Scouters that are interested in helping Scouts in their troops earn the Eagle Rank. It can also help troop leaders and current Eagle Coaches keep abreast of changes in the Eagle Scout process. Troop leaders can use this training as an opportunity to get additional parents involved, by asking them to take on the Eagle Coach responsibility as their 1 hour a week contribution to Scouting. Serving as an Eagle Coach is one way to help the Scoutmaster and Troop Committee maintain a viable program.

We will be scheduling this training twice a year, as we do with the Life to Eagle Seminar, so it should be easier for the troop committee to find adults who are available to participate in a 3 hour training once a year, and then work with Eagle Scout candidates to help them accomplish this prestigious goal that will last their life time.
