Numbers

- Max 160 Scouts
- Patrol Max 10 Scouts, 2 Adults per Patrol
 - Troops with two or more Patrols get an extra Adult
- AOL Den- Max 10 Scouts, 3 Adults per Den
- Will need extra volunteers!
- Campsite limits
 - 35 for larger sites
 - 25 for smaller sites

Prep

- COR letter of permission required!
- Everyone needs to track temp and symptoms for 2 weeks prior
 - This includes drivers who are not staying
- Everyone needs to sign waiver (youth must have adult signature)
- Units need to triple check paperwork before coming up
- Units need to check temperatures before coming up
 - Units are recommended to have a contactless thermometer

If anyone fails medical check upon arrival, ALL occupants of that vehicle must go home

Travel

- Max four people (including driver) per car
 - Do NOT mix Patrols. Only Patrol members may ride in same car.
 - Masks worn in car
 - Air not to be recirculated
 - Exception: If all people live in the same household, may have more than four
- Recommend no stops on the way
- Arrive at camp, and park in main lot.
- Entire Patrol must check in at same time

To campsite

- One vehicle per Patrol may travel to campsite
- Unload immediately, and then return to main parking lot
- If there is a Troop trailer, it may be parked at designated pad
 - The vehicle must be unhooked and parked in main lot
 - Only one person may be in a trailer at a time

It is required that any person handling another person's gear must wear gloves

Campsite set up

- Patrols must set up apart from other Patrols
- All tents are single only, except for household members
 - YPT rules still apply!
- Each Patrol must have their own separate cooking and cleaning area
- No camping in Cabins

- Cabins are for source of water only, and for dumping dishwater
 - No more than three members of the same patrol allowed in cabin at a time.

Latrines and bathhouses

- Each Unit has a designated stall in latrine
- No sharing
- Must be cleaned after use
 - Each Unit must bring a spray bottle with required pre-mix
- Bathhouse limited to three people per area
 - YPT rules in force
 - Bathhouses will be sanitized several times a day
 - Showers are not to be used except in an emergency

Patrol Cooking

- Max two cooks per meal.
- Gloves at all times
- Cooks will serve as well
- No Patrol sharing gear. Each Patrol must bring everything they need

Patrol Eating

- Disposable plates, utensils. No mess kits
 - Reusable Hot mugs are allowed, but on the user may touch it
- No shared food items
 - Example: Instead of a shared syrup bottle, bring individual packets
- Water jugs per patrol
 - Only that Patrol may use their own water jug
 - Each use: Sanitize, Use, Sanitize

Daily Health Report

- Each unit will complete a Temperature / symptom report in the AM.
- Anyone over 100 degrees to go home
- Report to be submitted before Assembly

Assemblies

- Masks
- Social Distancing
- Patrol spacing

Activity Trail

- Each Patrol will have a set schedule.
- Patrols can sit out an activity, but then lose that time slot
- Shared items will be sanitized in between Patrols.
- Patrols to bring their own material for some stations, such as fire building or orienteering
- One way traffic on Activity Trail
- AOL and 1st year Patrols MUST have an adult with them on the Trail.

Campfire

- Patrols will sit as a group on a single row, spread out as far as they can.
- Rows in between to be skipped
- Masks at all times
- No singing or cheering, only skits.

Departure

- After closing, 1 car per Patrol to campsite to load up.
- Sites to be inspected
- Awards handed out after inspection.

Individuals should monitor temperature for two weeks after event.

Registration

- Early bird closes 9/30
- Registration fully closes 10/16
- You will need your Patrol names, and rosters by Patrol when signing up.

Summary of special items a Unit will need

- Disposable plates and silverware for eating
- Hand sanitizer
- Extra masks
- Enough gloves for 5 pair per cook per meal
- Sanitizer for latrine cleaning
- Full Patrol cooking and cleaning gear, no swapping
- Extra drivers
- Contactless thermometer
- Paperwork, including COR/ Institution Head letter.
